SACRAMENTS & SPECIAL LITURGIES

Sacrament of Baptism:

Parishioners who desire to have a child baptized must have been registered for at least four months in the parish. Parents must attend a Baptismal Class for the first child; and periodically thereafter, as needed and as determined by the Pastor. Baptismal preparation sessions are available in English and in Spanish. Contact the Parish Office at 731-668-2596 or see the parish website or bulletin for class times and location.

Sacrament of Reconciliation:

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is available weekly and at seasonal parish penance services. Consult the parish bulletin for up-to-date confession times. Reconciliation is also available by appointment by contacting a priest at the Parish Office.

Children who are preparing to receive First Holy Eucharist also prepare to celebrate their First Reconciliation, usually during the 2nd grade year. Reconciliation is typically celebrated in the winter before First Holy Eucharist, which is celebrated during the Easter season. Several parent meetings are required in order for a child to be ready to receive this sacrament.

Contact Maximilian Hart, Director of Religious Education, at the Parish Office.

First Holy Eucharist (Children):

Children who receive this sacrament (usually in the spring of the 2nd grade year), must complete two years of faith formation (either in Children's Faith Formation or the parish school) leading up to the celebration. Several parent meetings are required in order for a child to be ready to receive this sacrament. Contact Maximilian Hart, Director of Religious Education, at the Parish Office.

Sacrament of Confirmation (Youths):

Confirmation preparation is a two-year process, typically during the 7th and 8th grade years. Teens may attend the Family Faith Formation sessions and/or the parish school during those two years. Teens must attend one Confirmation retreat provided by the parish during each year. Several parent and sponsor meetings are required in order for a teen to be ready to be confirmed. The celebration of Confirmation occurs in the spring during the Easter season, usually with the Bishop of Memphis presiding. Contact Maximilian Hart, Director of Religious Education, at the Parish Office.

Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA):

OCIA is the process by which non-Catholics can explore the Catholic Church and consider coming into full communion with the Church, with sacraments (Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation) being celebrated at the Easter Vigil Mass. A person may begin the process at any time of the year. See the bulletin for information on periodic inquiry nights. Our parish is also frequently in need of fully-initiated Catholics to journey with inquirers as sponsors. To engage in this process as an inquirer or sponsor, contact Maximilian Hart at the Parish Office.

Sacrament of Holy Matrimony:

Knowing the importance of establishing a Christ-centered relationship with Christ and one another, St. Mary's marriage preparation offers the engaged couple the opportunity to properly prepare for their vocation to the sacrament of Holy Matrimony. The aim of marriage preparation is to engage the couple in a sound, holy understanding of this sacrament, instituted by Christ himself. Couples should contact the Pastor at least six (6) months in advance of the desired marriage date.

Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick:

A priest is always available for this sacrament. Call the Parish Office at 731-668-2596 to request a priest. The after-hours answering service is available to contact an on-call priest at any hour.

Visit the Sick/Homebound:

Priests are available to visit the sick, anoint the sick, bring Holy Communion, and hear confessions. Also, Extraordinary Ministers to the Sick bring Holy Communion to those who are sick or recovering from illness or injury and cannot attend Mass.

Funerals:

Contact the Pastor to make arrangements for a funeral.

Children's Liturgy of the Word

This group exists to provide an opportunity for children (PreK-2nd grade) to hear readings and respond to them in a simpler language during the 10:30 a.m. Sunday Mass (offered throughout the school year). Choir - Accompanist

Individuals enhance worship by providing keyboard accompaniment for sung hymns and psalms led by a song leader or cantor.

Accompanists also provide instrumental music for prayer and reflection within the Mass and special liturgies.

Choir - Adult

This group enhances community worship with song at the 10:30 a.m. Sunday Mass. The Choir also sings at Holy Day/Vigil Masses, Christmas Midnight Mass, Holy Week services, Easter Masses, and at other special liturgies throughout the year. The Adult Choir promotes fellowship among parishioners in addition to increasing their knowledge of the Catholic faith through music.

TIME COMMITMENT: $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours on Sunday (30 minutes practice, followed by the Mass); and weekly practice on Wednesday evenings for a few weeks leading up to Advent/Christmas and Lent/Holy Week/Easter.

Choir - Cantors/Song Leader

These individuals lead the congregation in song during Mass and other liturgies.

TIME COMMITMENT: $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours on Sunday, when scheduled to serve (30 minutes practice, followed by the Mass).

Choir - Spanish Adult

This group enhances community worship with song at the 1:00 p.m. Sunday Spanish Mass, and occasional bilingual Masses.

Sacristans

Sacristans prepare the sacred vessels used at Mass. They provide a service for the celebrant and are responsible for maintaining the sacred vessels.

TIME COMMITMENT: Approximately once per month; some sacristans volunteer additional time to prepare for weekday Masses.

Ushers

Ushers provide for orderly movement and seating of parishioners during Mass. They also take up the collection and respond to emergency situations as necessary.

TIME COMMITMENT: 5 persons needed per weekend Mass and at Holy Day Liturgies.

LIFE LONG FAITH FORMATION

Adult Sunday School

St. Mary's Adult Sunday School meets between the Masses on Sunday mornings, from 9:15 to 10:15 a.m., during the school year. Gatherings are designed to provide a place for adults to learn more about their Catholic faith, and to gain understanding of how this knowledge is applicable in their daily lives.

Adult Retreats - Men

Men's retreats are held to provide men an opportunity to deepen their personal relationship with God, to rest, and to provide time to bond and form relationships with fellow parishioners.

TIME COMMITMENT: One weekend per year.

Adult Retreats - Women

Women's retreats are held to provide women an opportunity to deepen their personal relationship with God, to rest, and to provide time to bond and form relationships with fellow parishioners.

TIME COMMITMENT: Minimum one retreat per year.

Cursillo

Cursillo is a Movement of the Catholic Church. The name Cursillo de Cristiandad is Spanish, meaning a short course. It is a weekend of spiritual growth and renewal.

Family Faith Formation

During the school year (August through early May), children gather on most Sundays (9:10-10:20 a.m. OR 11:40 a.m.-12:50 p.m.), OR on Wednesdays (5:50-7:15 p.m.) for faith formation sessions. Groups are available for children from age 4 through Confirmation preparation (the 7th or 8th grade year, usually). Parents also engage in weekly formation sessions so they can continue formation at home with their children.

Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration

Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration is the permanent exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament and is coordinated by the laity of our parish, with the assistance of clergy. Pope John Paul II began Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament on December 2, 1981, in a chapel in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome and urged all parishes to do the same. Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration began in our Parish on January 15, 2012, at 5:00 p.m. immediately following the blessing of our newly constructed Divine Will and Mercy Chapel by Bishop Terry Steib. Jesus, in the Garden of Gethsemane, mournfully asked His disciples, "Could you not watch with me one hour?" (Mt 26:40) Through Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration we proclaim to our parish and community that Jesus is here, truly present among us today! Adorers often express how they value their Holy Hour.

EVANGELIZATION & COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Catholic Scouting - Cub Scout Family Program (boys and girls)

This group exists to support and assist with the operations of the cemetery by providing occasional labor for maintenance projects/clean-up as scheduled by the cemetery coordinator.

Prayer Line

The prayer line provides a rapid response of prayer in emergency situations, by coordinating and contacting all who are willing to pray for those in immediate need of prayer.

Respect Life Committee

Parishioners of St. Mary's give a voice to those whose life is at risk in our society through lack of respect. We are law-abiding citizens who, because of our faith, believe that all human life is God's creation and should be respected and protected. The committee educates parishioners on Church teachings concerning abortion, infanticide, euthanasia, fertility, sex education in the schools and other areas where life is at risk. The committee represents the Catholic Church's position on these life issues to the wider community. This committee also serves as a source of information on services and counseling available in our community for those in need of counseling for unplanned pregnancies and for post-abortion counseling services. TIME COMMITMENT: Flexible.

Room in the Inn

A national program for homeless men begun by Father Charles Strobel in Nashville, Tennessee, works as a partnership between Area Relief Ministries (ARM) and local churches, including St. Mary's. ARM coordinates the program and provides sheets, blankets, towels, pillows and cots. Local congregations allow the men to sleep in their facility from 6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m., providing dinner and a light breakfast. Volunteers are needed to prepare the meals, serve and clean up. Also, two men parishioners are needed to stay overnight with the guests. We host Room in the Inn once a month, at First Methodist Church in downtown Jackson, typically the first Thursday of every month. This program has provided shelter for hundreds of men and created life changing relationships through fellowship with the guests. TIME COMMITMENT: Flexible, typically 3-4 hours, 2-3 days a year.

Soup Kitchen Volunteers

The larger Jackson community prepares a hot meal daily for the hungry of the area. St. Mary's provides volunteers and desserts several weeks during the year through the RIFA program.

Women's Ministry - The Well

The mission of The Well Ministry is to help all women deepen their relationship with Jesus Christ through the overflowing power of the Holy Spirit, to be filled with the Living Water and to joyfully proclaim and live out the Gospel of our Lord.

The group is for all women of St. Mary's and the Jackson area community. TIME COMMITMENT: Meets approximately 2 evenings per month, flexible about attendance.

STEWARDSHIP & PLANNING

Pastoral Council

The Pastoral Council is made up of parish members who assist the Pastor in carrying out the responsibilities of parish life. They provide insight into the pastoral needs of the parish and overall leadership by directing activities and programs that promote a strong spiritual and family foundation.
